SUMMER UNIFORM

Thank you very much to those who have attended to this and a reminder that we are wanting to be in summer uniform by the end of this week.

For Year 8 students whose summer tunic may no longer fit, rather than purchase a tunic for 1 term only, we allow the winter tunic to be worn until the end of the year. The footwear for the summer is either roman sandals (blue for the girls, while there are none available in town, we believe One Shoe Warehouse in Tauranga or Hamilton may have them, if not possible, brown preferably, but black if you cannot get brown). The alternative to that is the normal black school shoe with a white ankle sock for the girls and a grey knee sock for the boys

The boys socks are able to be purchased at school for \$12/pr and the girls can just be purchased at Warehouse, or Postie +. Thank you for your attention to our uniform being worn correctly.
